James McDougall, in his report on Northern Transport, March 1893:

The boat [*Wrigley*] has been run since 1887 by Capt. John Bell, whose wages are \$1,500 per annum. He is an excellent and competent Captain and Engineer and well worth the salary he receives if his services could be fully utilized; but as the navigation of the waters of the Mackenzie is easy and he is actively employed only about 4 months in the year, a far cheaper man would answer the purpose...
